 - They receive more than half of their support from your parent(s); and
 - They will continue to receive more than half of their support from your parent(s) during the award year (July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025).

- Yourself, the student
- Your spouse, if applicable
- Your dependent(s), if all of the following are true:
 - They live with you (or live apart because of college enrollment);
 - They receive more than half of your support; and
 - They will continue to receive more than half of your support during the award year (July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025).
- Other persons, if the following is true:
 - They live with you;
 - They receive more than half of your support; and
 - They will continue to receive more than half of their support from you during the award year (July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025).

The provided criteria for "dependent children" or "other persons" align with the requirement that family size align with whom the student or parent could claim as a dependent on a U.S. tax return if the student or parent were to file a U.S. tax return at the time of completing the 2024-2025 FAFSA. As a result, the student or parent should not include any unborn children in the family size.
