## **Admission Policy for Traditional ADN Program**

## MINIMUM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Unconditional admission to the college.
- 2. Receipt of completed application for the ADN Nursing Program by posted deadline.
- 3. A minimum of 2.50 GPA for any attempted nursing core academic prerequisite/corequisite courses with a grade of "C" or higher ENG 101, MTH 100, BIO 201, BIO 202, SPH 106/107, PSY 210, BIO 220, and a humanities elective –from a regionally accredited institution.
- 4. Cumulative GPA must be a minimum of 2.0 at ESCC or most recent transferring institution.
- 5. Eligibility is required for English Composition I (ENG 101) and Intermediate College Algebra (MTH 100) during the first semester, if not previously taken.
- 6. Good standing with the college.
- 7. Meeting the essential functions required for nursing with and without reasonable accommodations.
- 8. Completion of the ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS ®) taken within three years of the application deadline.

## **Admission Policy for LPN to ADN Mobility Program**

## MINIMUM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Unconditional admission to the college.
- 2. Receipt of completed application for the ADN Nursing Program by deadline.
- A minimum of 2.50 GPA for any attempted nursing core academic prerequisite/corequisite
  courses with a grade of "C" or higher ENG 101, MTH 100, BIO 201, BIO 202, SPH
  106/107, PSY 210, BIO 220, and a humanities elective –from a regionally accredited
  institution.
- 4. Cumulative GPA must be a minimum 2.0 at ESCC or most recent transferring institution.
- 5. Completion of the following pre-requisite courses for LPN to ADN Mobility-

Prerequisite Courses with a grade of "C" or higher:

- MTH 100 (or Higher-Level Math) (3 credithours)
- BIO 201 Human Anatomy and Physiology I (4 credit hours)
- BIO 202 Human Anatomy and Physiology II (4 credit hours)
- ENG 101 English Composition (3 credit hours)
- PSY 210 Human Growth and Development (3 credit hours)
- SPH 106 or 107 Speech (3 credit hours)
- 6. Good standing with the college.
- 7. Meeting the essential functions required for nursing with and without reasonable accommodations.
- 8. Completion of the ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS ®) taken within three years of the application deadline.
- 9. Proof of:
  - a. active, unencumbered LPN License

Admission to the Associate Degree Nursing Program is competitive, and the number of students is limited by the number of faculty and clinical facilities available. <u>Meeting minimal requirements does not guarantee acceptance</u>.

A required minimum course grade of "C" for any attempted nursing <u>and</u> core academic pre-requisite/corequisite courses.
